Vienna demands are divided in three categories:

1. Demand with clear wording
2. Demands that need to be more specified and defined more clearly
3. Demands that are controversy and need more discussion

Participants:

1. confirm the group “clear demands”
2. find better definitions and wording of the “unclear demands”
3. discuss “controversy demands” and decide to include / exclude them from the list of demands (because if wording is unclear, it does not make sense to include it into the manifest)

Currently there is the **Austria's EU presidency in 2018**. The Austrian government has outlined “Safety & Security” as one of its main priorities. It will maintaining Europe’s competitiveness through digitization, and stability in Austria’s neighbouring countries (working towards EU accession for Western Balkan countries).

**Self-Organised Group Discussions:** 8 groups:  
per group: 1 moderator: in charge of leading discussion  
1 group representor: presentation of group results

**Questions to be discussed:**

- What does safety mean? The Vienna demands include different aspects of safety such as social safety, healthcare insurance, etc. etc.
- On which safety factors do we agree on?
- Which safety measures are appropriate: e.g. more / less police, social welfare, ...
